GET READY!

Now that the stormy season is with us it's time to get ourselves set for cold temperatures, power outages, roads blocked by fallen trees and debris, and other seasonal hazards.

The Town of Coupeville recommends that residents take at least two important sets of action:

1. STOCK UP

You may not be able to get to the store for several days during and after a major winter storm. Remember to have the basics on hand to get you through at least 3-7 days. Some suggested items:

- canned food that can be eaten as is, or heated outside via a small propane stove
- enough water - 1 gallon per person per day - if you get water from a well and your pump is not working
- high-energy snacks
- pet food
- medicines

2. STAY IN TOUCH

Remember those 2-sided window cards that were distributed to homes in Coupeville? Red/HELP - Green/OK cards posted in windows can help first responders quickly survey neighborhoods and note the status of households displaying these cards.

Also, the Town prepared and distributed magnetic cards carrying important local phone numbers, with space provided for you to add your family contact information. The cards also indicate locations in Town where emergency information will be posted in the event of a major event here.

Use these tools to inform your neighbors how you are doing, and to remind yourself how to get in touch with your family and the Town during local and widespread emergencies.

You can pick up these cards at Town Hall.

POWER OUTAGE

In the event of a power outage, you can call Puget Sound Energy to report the outage, 888.225.5773. After the outages are initially reported, PSE tries to keep an updated recording to report estimated repair times.

PSE is also in contact with Town staff, since operation of our utilities is dependent on electrical service. In the event of a prolonged outage, we will change the recording on the Town Hall phone to give an update. For example "PSE estimates the power outage will be at least 6 more hours, until approximately 10:30 p.m."

SUPPORT YOUR LOCAL COMMUNITY

These are tough economic times, and the resiliency of our local economy depends on us shopping our local businesses whenever possible. Please try to do your holiday shopping here at home, and if you can't buy it in Coupeville, try to do it on the Island. It will keep your neighbors employed and tax dollars in your local community!

EMERGENCY SHELTER

If the power outage occurs during cold weather, and is expected to be extensive, the Town will open an emergency shelter at the Rec. Hall. Hot soup will be available, as will cots for sleeping, board games for entertainment, and friends or neighbors with whom you may commiserate!

If a shelter is opened, the recording on the Town Hall phone will include that information, too. In addition, signs will be posted at the post office, the courthouse, and area businesses.
